Well done to our Year 6 Pupils

This week, our Year 6 children have completed 6 different SATs test papers across 4 days, covering grammar, spelling, reading and maths. The tests are rigorous and require lots of concentration. The children need to work independently, managing their time carefully. Throughout the week, the children have shown exemplary attitudes, absolute determination and lots of stamina! All adults who have worked with our Year 6 children this week noticed their efforts to do their very best and we are all enormously proud of them. Very well done, Year 6!

School Behaviour Support Information Sessions

Thank you to parents and carers who attended one of our information sessions yesterday about the way in which school now supports and manages behaviour. The sessions covered some key messages about changes we have made this year and outlined the main ways in which we positively recognise pupils conduct and behaviour in school. Parents were also told about the consequences that are in place for pupils who do not meet behavioural expectations and our support pathway for children who struggle to manage their emotions and behaviours.

We also discussed recent training that staff had undergone and parents had a chance to pick up some useful information leaflets to support behaviour at home.

The parents and carers who attended gave very positive feedback and therefore, we plan to **run this session again** early in the next half term so more parents and carers can access this important information. The date for this is **Friday 9th June** and we will be offering a choice of 2 session times: 2.15 - 3.15 pm or 5.00 - 6.00 pm

Good luck Half Marathon Runners!

On Sunday morning, some of our KS2 children will be undertaking the last mile of their Plymouth Schools Partnership Half Marathon Challenge. They will be joining hundreds of other Plymouth school children to run their last mile around The Hoe. This is a great event which takes place on the same day as the adult Plymouth half marathon - the atmosphere on The Hoe is fantastic! We want to say GOOD LUCK to our runners and WELL DONE to all who are participating. This will be a wonderful achievement. Reminder for parents of pupils running in the event to meet at 'The Wedding Cake' on the waterfront side of The Hoe at 10.15 am. See you there!

IMPORTANT: Changes to the external gates access

This week, we have started to make changes to the way in which some of our external gates are controlled. These are the gates that you and your children use to enter and exit the school site. These are the changes:

The Main entrance (using the pedestrian pathway from Oxford Street):

To **exit** - there is no longer a green push release button on the wall to press for exit. This is replaced with an intercom system to communicate with the office staff, who will then open the gates for you. This system is exactly the same as the current **entry** system for this gate - press the intercom buzzer, stand in front of the camera and you will be let in.

The Lower entrance (on Hastings Terrace)

This remains the same at the moment but the system will be changed over the half term holiday to match the system on the Main gates (above). You will need to use an intercom system and camera to get IN and OUT.

The Field entrance (along Oxford Street)

This is the entrance used by many of our EYFS and KS1 parents and carers. This gate has had the push release button removed and now has no means to manually open the gate without a key fob. There is no intercom system on this gate on either side. **This gate will only be opened and closed at drop off and pick up times.** At all other times it will remain closed and access to the school grounds will be via the intercom system on the Main and Lower (Hastings Terrace) entrances.

These are the times that all gates will be opened by our caretaker for ease of access at these busy times (just as they are now):

Drop off: 8.45 - 9.05 am (20 mins) Pick up: 15.05 - 15.30 pm (25 mins)

Due to these changes, I ask that all parents and carers leave the school grounds as swiftly as possible after drop off or pick up, before the caretaker locks the external gates up. It will take us all some time to get used to the system but the changes are in the best interests of site security - thank you for your cooperation.

Nuts in school - snacks and packed lunches

A reminder that we are a 'nut-free' school due to a number of pupils having severe nut allergies. Therefore, we ask all parents/carers NOT to send any products with nuts into school, including as snacks, in packed lunches or in any other foods. Your support with this is vital to us ensuring a safe environment for our pupils with allergies. Thank you.

Keeping safe

This week hosted some visitors from the RNLI. They led our assembly and taught us about how to stay safe when we visit the beach. They taught us about the different coloured flags you see on a beach and what those flags mean. They also taught us about rip currents and how to call for help if you were stuck in the water. They reminded us to call 999 if we saw someone in trouble in the water and not to go into the water to try and help ourselves. We also learnt about the job of a lifeguard and the important role they play in keeping us safe while we have fun in the sun at the beach.







Both Year 2 classes have also had a visitor from the Dental school this week. They were taught about the importance of correctly brushing and caring for their teeth. They learnt about how the food we eat affects the health of our teeth and our bodies. They also learnt about fluoride and how this protects their teeth and helps to keep them strong and healthy.
